#### II. CALL TO ORDER:

There being a quorum, Chairperson Bingcang called the pre-bid conference to order at 1:05 PM and welcomed the prospective bidders.

#### III. PRE-ELIGIBILITY CONFERENCE PROPER

A. Mr Marvin Carreon presented the details of the project to the prospective bidders. The salient points were as follows:

### a. Approved Budget for the Contract

The approved budget for the contract (ABC) is Php 27,983,000.00, inclusive of all government taxes and fees

#### b. **Duration of the Project**

It shall take effect from the date stated in the Notice to Proceed (NTP) and shall remain in force and effect for 300 Calendar days starting from receipt of NTP

# c. Legal Framework and Bid Parameter

Quality Cost Based Evaluation (QCBE) under RA 9184

#### d. Obligations of the Consultant

- Ensure that all works are accomplished according to approved plans and specifications
- Review, certify and recommend approval on the submitted designs in accordance with the Codes and Standards, MPSS, NCC DSG, among others
- Supervise and inspect construction works and implementation schedule
- Review and verify findings during the testing and commissioning
- Recommend acceptance of works
- Maintain all documents of the Project from pre-construction up to its completion and final acceptance and provide BCDA with weekly and monthly reports

# REMINDERS ON SIGNING, SEALING AND MARKING OF BIDS

Each and every page of the Technical Proposal Submission Form and the Financial Proposal Submission Form shall be signed by the duly authorized representative/s of the Consultant. Failure to do so shall be a ground for the rejection of the bid.

Any interlineations, erasures or overwriting shall be valid only if they are signed or initialed by the duly authorized representative of the Consultant.

The original and the copy of the Bid shall be typed or written in indelible ink and shall be signed by the prospective bidder or its duly authorized representative.

#### **SEALING AND MARKING OF BID DOCUMENTS**

All envelopes shall:

- a. contain the name of the contract to be bid in capital letters;
- b. bear the name and address of the Consultant in capital letters;
- c. be addressed to BCDA's BAC specified in accordance with ITB Clause 18.1;
- d. bear the specific identification of this bidding process indicated in ITB Clause 1.2;
- e. bear a warning "DO NOT OPEN BEFORE..." the date and time for the opening of bids, in accordance with ITB Clause 18.

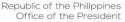
Questions	Answer/ Clarification
We would like to know if you will allow the replacement of personnel? Thank you	Sec 33.3 of the Revised IRR of RA 9184 provides that, "There should be no replacement of key personnel before the awarding of contract, except for justifiable reason as may be determined by the BAC, such as, illness, death, or resignation provided it is duly supported by relevant certificates, or any delay caused by the Procuring Entity. The BAC shall immediately consider negotiation with the next ranked consultant if unjustifiable replacement of personnel by the first ranked firm is made. Once the contract has been awarded, no replacement shall be allowed by the HoPE until after fifty percent (50%) of the personnel's man-months have been served, except for justifiable reasons, subject to appropriate sanctions as prescribed in the PBDs".





	Yes, bidders may specify "to be named" if the names of the support staff to be utilized/involved in the project cannot be provided yet during the bid submission.
	Yes, GCC Clause 46 is not applicable since this clause is intended for the Detailed Architectural and Engineering Design Services and not for the Construction Management and Supervision Services.
GCC Clause 53.2 is inconsistent with the payment scheme stated in Section 11 of Terms of Reference, which will govern?	Section 12 (Mode of Payment) of the Terms of Reference (TOR) will govern.
Is GCC Clause 56 applicable when the delay is due to Contractor's inability to complete the work.	GCC Clause 56 is applicable only when the Consultant fails to deliver any or all of the services within the period specified in the Contract. Failure of the Contractor to deliver its required services is irrelevant to this Clause.
Please specify what other technical support services are deemed relevant.	The required other technical support services that may arise during the project implementation stage are still subject to agreement of both parties (BCDA and Consultant).
Section 19, Item 1 of the TOR did not mention delay due to inability of the contractor to complete the work on time. When this happens, BCDA will require the CMS to extend time. Will the CMS be granted additional compensation?	Item 2 of Annex F of RA 9184 - Contract Implementation Guidelines for the Procurement of Consulting Services provides that, "All Consultancy contracts shall be fixed price contracts. Any extension of contract time shall not involve any additional cost."
