AID TO INTERNAL STAKEHOLDERS: BCDA WORKFORCE

Provision of COVID-19 Relief Assistance for Affected Workers

BCDA management considers the workforce as its most important resource and asset.

In July 2020, the Office of the President and CEO, through PAD implemented a COVID-19 Relief Assistance Project for the benefit of COVID-affected employees, and security personnel. Aid is in the form of relief packs worth Php5,000.00, inclusive of rice, grocery items, vitamins and alcohol. The value of relief packs was subsequently reduced to Php 3,000 (June to October 2022).

The COVID Relief Assistance Project is aligned with BCDA's CSR philosophy as it endeavors to give dignity to the workforce caught in the unfortunate circumstance. With the majority being heads of families, the battle of the worker against COVID-19 has become more difficult physically, and even mentally. It is understood that providing basic food necessities will help the worker or his family members surpass this socio-economic and health crisis they are all in, especially if the COVID-positive patient is the head of the family. Those affected are unable to provide basic necessities while in quarantine, especially so for cases wherein there are other infected family members. Aside from being limited in movement, there may also be financial implications among

those unable to report to work.

Jointly carried out by PAD in cooperation with PPMD, HRMD, SAPMD, and GSD, the project seeks to achieve the following:

- o to provide management the opportunity to look after the welfare of affected workers:
- o to provide economic assistance in the form of basic necessities to affected workers and their families;
- o to boost morale of co-workers and help them surpass the challenge; and
- o to rouse awareness on the need for a culture of caring for fellow co-workers in need especially those affected by COVID-19.

Relief assistance continued until October 2022, following President Rodrigo Duterte's declaration of the extension of the period of state of calamity throughout the country effective September 13, 2021 until September 12, 2022 per <u>Presidential Proclamation No. 1218</u>.

Since July 2020 up to October 2022, 563 workers benefited from the distribution of BCDA's Covid-19 relief packs, Total amount spent for relief packs is Two Million Four Hundred Forty-Five Thousand Pesos (Php 2,445,000.00)

COVID-19 Relief Fund

Since the start of the pandemic in March 2020, BCDA employees have sought ways to help co-workers infected with the coronavirus. Help came in various forms of basic necessities, purchased through the pooled monetary donations by employees. Eventually, this became the BCDA Employees' Help Fund, created in July 2020 through the digital wallet G-Cash.

The starting fund then was at Php29,942.00, which has reached an all-time high donation value of Php189,126.00. This, benefited 115 workers and their families in 2021 and 30 workers (out of 267 cases) in 2022. By year-end, the balance is Php56,227.00.

The fund is managed by volunteers consisting of 11 members from the Office of the Senior Vice President for Corporate Services, the Public Affairs Department (PAD), Subsidiaries, Affiliates and Projects Management Department (SAPMD), Internal Audit Services Department (IASD), Property and Procurement Management Department-General Services Division (PPMD-GSD), the Security Management Department (SMD), the Engineering and Social Support Department, and the HRMD.

A shared database of affected employees with their full name, department, home address, contact number, and isolation status was accessible to both COVID teams, and

this was supported by a dashboard built by the Information and Communication Technology Department (ICTD).

What is characteristic about the CSR Team's operations is the fast response time to accommodate anything that the employee needs while in isolation or in treatment--whether it be fruits, batteries, toiletries, milk for their isolated child, maintenance medicines of patients with comorbidities, and even oxygen tank refills. The Fund has been utilized not just for the benefit of colleagues, but also for the family members seeking healing and compassion.
